- After closing off entries, if there are less than five (5) animals and/or three (3) exhibitors entered in the classes/sections, the Host Association may then amalgamate classes/sections as necessary.
- Height certificates and performance cards to be carried for all height-stipulated sections/classes.

Camping Information

Camping on site is available for Friday March 6th. **Please ensure you note this on your entry.** If you are camping Friday night, we ask that you tell us how many people are camping and if not members, please pre-pay your gate entry fees).

- Entry through Gate 4.
- Power is not available.
- Port-a-loo onsite by the equestrian arena & toilet block with shower facilities now available at the back of the hall (opposite the show office)
- No permanent yard for horses is available.
- Temporary pens can be erected overnight but these must be removed before 8:00 am March 7th. This is a RAS rule and MUST be followed.
- Water trough is available for horses.
- No entry into the cattle area of the showgrounds
- These grounds are private property, please 'leave them as you find them.'
- No charges but a donation is welcomed. Happy camping 😊

Guidelines for Entering Saddle Events:

- OPEN CLASSES – All Horses and Ponies may enter, including Novices.
- NOVICE CLASSES – A Novice is a Horse or Pony that has won 0-5 firsts in a conformation class, at any A&P Show, at the time of the show, unless otherwise specified. Once a Horse or Pony has had 6 wins it is no longer eligible to enter Novice classes.

If a Novice entry has gained 6 wins before the day of the show, the competitor must advise the secretary and may change to an Open class or if no class remains to enter a refund will be given at such time the show committee decides.

Novice Champions are not eligible for Open Championships unless they have won their Open class, nor are they eligible for Supreme.

- LADY'S and GENTLEMAN'S classes – Wins DO NOT count as an Open Conformation Class or judged in the Championship.

All Horses and Ponies must be named. No Ponies are allowed in any Horse classes unless stated.

In all rings first prize winners only are to parade for Champion, and the second placed animals are to stand by for Reserve Champion.

AGES:

- Age or Riders/Handlers are as at 1 August 2025
- Horse/Ponies 3 years and under are not to be ridden.

HATS/HELMETS

- a) In all cases current Work Safe New Zealand rules prevail.
- b) All riders, including harness drivers/with the exclusion of heavy horses (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS-affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within a Showgrounds or the grounds of an affiliated Event.
- c) Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards. These standards may be subject to change, but the latest list can be found at <http://www.ras.org.nz> – equestrian. RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook.
- d) All hats/helmets that conform as per c) must be identified by the current tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS.

Please note: As from 1 August 2023, Standards are changing, and a ‘Yellow’ Tag must be shown.

FALL OF RIDER

If a rider has a fall or suspected head injury, at any time at a RAS affiliated Show/Event in the: competition ring/arena, practice/warmup/collecting ring/arena; or elsewhere within the grounds of where the show/event is being convened, the rider must be removed from the activity and checked by the show/event's nominated First Aid service/personnel and be given the ‘all-clear’ before the rider is permitted to re-mount and continue riding at the show/event.

In-Line Resolution Process Policy

This show supports the RAS In-Line Resolution Process Policy which will operate in the Equestrian Section of all affiliated show and will be offered for any inappropriate behavior towards show officials, judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the show bringing the equestrian discipline into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the Conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and/or Exhibitors as provide in the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges rulebook and rule 13 of the RAS Constitution”.

Implementation of the Policy will be in accordance with the RAS Rules that accompanied this card, and full wording of the ‘Policy is available to view on the RAS website. www.ras.org.nz

In all Height stipulated sections/classes at the Rai Valley A & P show (exempt - In Hand Coloured and Future Stars rings) a current height and performance card must be carried and shown to the ring steward.

Miniature Horse classes: Category A up to 34 inches, - Category B up to 38 inches

All miniature horse entries must be registered with the NZMHA. Miniature Horse height for age rules applies to all horses competing in this section. Classes will be run under the NZMHA rules.

The current RAS height certificate and copy the Breed Registration certificate must be available for viewing on request.
